

Judging

The Judges will base their selection on total points awarded for the following:

INFORMATION

Accuracy, applicability, focus on topic—40 points

PERSONAL DYNAMICS

Voice, poise, professional appearance—30 points

TOTAL EFFECT

Effectiveness of visual aids, professional presentation, amount of work put into presentation ie. Handouts, original material as opposed to pre-packaged from a commercial source, research and variety—30 pts
for a total 100 points possible.

Judges are selected for their experience and expertise in the field of dentistry and in the topic areas of the clinics being presented.

The EDAA holds an annual Table Clinic Competition to give Registered Dental Assistants, Office Administrators, Office Managers and Receptionists an opportunity to present information of value to others in the dental professions and compete for the EDAA Clinic Award.

The EDAA Clinic Award consists of our Annual Trophy engraved with the names of our Table Clinic Competition award winners, an engraved gift for the winner to keep and their choice of paid registration to the annual provincial dental congress or a monetary award.

Competition Rules

1. Maximum of 2 Clinicians per clinic presentation.
2. Clinician(s) is responsible for informing the Education Director of AV equipment required and other set-up requirements for their presentation. Clinician(s) is responsible for the rental fee for any equipment not owned by the EDAA.
3. Length of presentation—6—8 minutes.
4. Topic—related to Dentistry.
5. Format—initial presentation to a large group. Subsequent questions / answers to small groups or individuals.
6. Professional Appearance—Uniform.
